Paintings created by German artist, Hinrich Schueler, and sculptures, from United States' Milan Kralik are located in the Freyberger Gallery in the Perkins Student Center at Penn State Berks.

As you walk in you'll be amazed by the colorful and bright paintings that Schueler has created. He introduces abstract expressionism, and uses numerous radiant colors, while exhibiting a unique painting style of his own.
